The Australian Motoring Festival - Melbourne



Well the VACC/RACV Australian Motoring Festival 2015 was a great event for AMMA & our members. First I would just like to acknowledge the generosity of the RACV who invited us to attend and provided AMMA with a free site in the fantastic "History of Motoring" display hall. I am not sure of the commercial site prices for this event, but based on other exhibitions attended I would estimate this site would have been worth in excess of \$3000 to a commercial exhibitor.

Overall the event was attended by around 25,000 visitors mainly on the Saturday & Sunday. Thursday & Friday had quite low attendance possibly due in part to the inclement weather. AMMA still had quite good contacts on these days as many of the commercial exhibitors and owners of vehicles on display availed themselves of the chance to have a good look around the huge show grounds site.

A special word of thanks to our stand volunteers, Matt Lombard who travelled over from the National Motor Museum -Birdwood, SA (3 days). Brian Ebert from the Fox Classic Car Collection, Duncan Malcolm, Ian & Jan Kennedy (2 days) & Leigh & Cheryl Sheilds, all from Gippsland Vehicle Collection. It was only through our volunteers efforts we were able to open from 10am till 8pm every day of the event. Thank you to all.

Finally we would also like to thank all the members who sent us brochures, we distributed nearly 4,000 member brochures in total, with 1440 of these being the new AMMA National brochures. http://www.australianmotoringfestival.com.au/



Reference Library: Some 12,700 manuals, motoring books and motor related publications have been donated to the Museum and are in need of a dedicated stand-alone environmentally protected room. It will include copying facilities, research/study area and a computer.

Lecture Room and Theatrette: This learning centre will allow our education program to have its own home with state of the art appliances for school groups, technical institutions and universities. This dual purpose facility will be available to car, motorcycle, truck clubs etc. and other members of the Whiteman Park community for meetings and seminars etc.



Workshop: This will include two hoists, technical equipment (modern and vintage) for practical use, demonstration and display along with a viewing window for visitors. There will also be scope for trainee education. Above all, the workshop will provide a dedicated and safe resource to preserve and maintain our fleet of Museum vehicles.

Amenities: A bigger new kitchen, resting area, dining room, disabled toilet, office, shower facility and change room.

AMMA was able to provide a letter of support for this project. Congratulations to all involved at the MMWA..
