Welcome by President, Colin Kiel, and invited members present to give a brief rundown of their operations

Carl Amor from the Gold Coast Museum -The property has a 250-300 seat restaurant and restaurant is open Saturday and Sunday. He, like many others, are having staffing issues. The museum is built as a tribute to his Mum and Dad. There are 2 brothers who run it, highlighting a 1913 Rover Tourer which was their Dads vehicle. Currently restoring 3 cars including a 1936 Cord. They have Council approval to increase their capacity by 2,000 m2.

Peter from Gippsland Historical Vehicle Collection - Has not been at the museum for a while, but still on the committee. There have been display changes, there is now a Hot Rod Association included headed by Andrew Gallagher. Covid lockdowns were worse in Victoria, and so now have reopened and back to almost pre Covid times. The roof is being replaced due to asbestos and funding is being addressed for the rest of the roof.

Matthew from Birdwood - There were 1500 cars books in at the museum for the Bay to Birdwood Rally. The museum is almost back to pre Covid times. There are many personnel changes - he will no longer be the Curator and only be at Birdwood 2 days/week. Paul Rees is manger marketing and audience experience but Birdwood would like to continue on AMMA board but someone will be appointed by the History Trust.

Ian spoke re Qld - There are now many new museums opening in Qld with one of the newest being the Gold Coast Museum. There is a "Lakeside" group which include a restaurant, shop soon to be launched. Wagners are trying to get one going at Toowoomba. Possibility of a Research library, Qld Motorsport museum is no longer.
